## **2006 is an Exciting and Important Year For Arizona Democrats:**

**2006 is a critical year because Arizona Democrats have an opportunity to:**

- **Elect a Democratic U.S. Senator:**
  - **Former Arizona Democratic Party Chairman Jim Pederson is running to unseat Jon Kyl in the U.S. Senate.**
  - **Jim Pederson will be a great U.S. Senator because he'll stand up for Arizona's families. Pederson will be an independent leader, offering common sense solutions on taxes, health care and immigration.**

- **Re-elect Governor Janet Napolitano:**

  - **Governor Napolitano has pushed for all-day kindergarten and full funding to protect Arizona's children. Napolitano has also pushed for tougher federal action to secure the US-Mexico border. She is an effective chief executive who has focused on moving Arizona forward and keeping Arizona safe, strong & prosperous.**
  - **Without Governor Napolitano's veto power, the extreme Republican Legislature would have enacted dangerous and irresponsible laws, including allowing guns in bars.**
  
- **Re-elect Attorney General Terry Goddard:**
  - **Since taking oath as Attorney General, Goddard has focused on consumer justice by fighting internet crime, especially identity theft and cybercrimes against children.**
  - **Goddard has tackled the evils of predatory lending and he has lead the fight against the Meth epidemic in Arizona.**
  - **The person running against Terry is a partisan "yes-man" who has no real prosecutorial or public service experience.**

- **Electing more Democrats to the AZ Legislature :**
  - **Because of Governor Napolitano's popularity and the Republican Party's inability to get a viable candidate to run against her, The AZ Republican Party's goal in 2006 is to obtain a Veto-Proof legislature.**
  - **A Republican veto-proof legislature would push for tax breaks for the wealthy & special interests, private school vouchers, 24-hour waiting period for abortions, and rouge patrols of our borders.**
  - **Republicans need just one more seat in the House and two seats in the Senate to achieve this veto-proof status.**
  - **Democrats have to pick up seats, recruit strong mainstream candidates and register new voters.**
  
- **Poll after poll shows that Arizonans prefer common sense policies and solutions like those offered by Governor Napolitano, Attorney General Goddard, and U.S. Senate candidate Jim Pederson. Arizonans reject the extreme-right-wing agenda exemplified by Jon Kyl and the Republican Legislature.**
  
- **A recent poll conducted by Arizona State University found that a majority (51%) of registered voters disapproved of the job President Bush is doing because of his handling of the war and his perceived lack of competence.**
  
- **Based upon the job Governor Napolitano is doing, 60% of those surveyed said they would give her another 4 years in office.**
