Dear Mr. McCain:

This letter constitutes a request under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. §552 (“FOIA”), and is submitted by the undersigned individuals who are concerned about the future direction of the U.S. Supreme Court and the impact of the Court’s future decisions on our lives and our country.

The nomination of Judge John Roberts to the U.S. Supreme Court puts at stake the progress our country has made in its commitment to preserve, defend and expand the basic human, civil and constitutional rights of all Americans. Based on the limited information that has been made available, serious legitimate questions have been raised about Judge Roberts’ commitment to civil rights, the rights of women, to the Voting Rights Act and the right to vote, to the right to privacy and to freedom from government interference in our most private and personal affairs and decisions. The American people are entitled to a full understanding of Judge Roberts’ views and past actions with respect to these issues as they affect the lives of every American.

To that end, we request all documents in the possession, custody or control of the Office of Solicitor General that were authored, in whole or part, by John G. Roberts, Jr., while he served as an employee of the Office of Solicitor General, that refer or relate to any of the following cases:
